



IALS FELLOWSHIPS: 2011-2012

Applications are now being invited for the following Fellowships, tenable for the period 1 October 2011 – 31 August 2012 or for any period (being at least three months) between those dates.

VISITING FELLOWSHIPS

These Fellowships are designed for persons already established in their own field of activity who are undertaking work within fields covered by or adjacent to the Institute's own research programmes or interests, which are currently in the following areas of research: Access to Justice; the Legal Profession; Legal Education; European Law; Legislative Drafting; Company and Commercial Law; International Financial Regulation; Financial services law; Access to legal information. (NB: While these topics are preferred, the Institute is ready to consider other proposals).

The Fellowships are not confined to academic lawyers but are also open to scholars of other disciplines working in the relevant fields, and to practising lawyers or judges with scholarly projects to pursue. They are not available to support postgraduate students' research.

VISITING FELLOWSHIP IN LAW LIBRARIANSHIP

The Institute considers applications in respect of any area of law librarianship but would particularly welcome any project which relates to the following activities in which its own library is involved: the development of foreign, comparative and international law collections; the provision of electronic legal information services; the Free Access to Law Movement; implementation of the Innopac Millennium system in law libraries.
