



Maurice Glinton QC

Maurice Owen Glinton QC is a Barrister and Counsel and Attorney in private practice at the Bahamas Bar in civil litigation, primarily in the areas of Constitutional and Administrative, Corporate/Commercial law and extradition law. He read law at Cambridge University (St John's College) and is a member of Gray's Inn (London, England) having been admitted to the Bar of England and Wales in November 1980. He was appointed one of her Majesty's Counsel for the Bahamas in 2009.

He graduated from the University of Maine (Orono, Me.) in 1972 with a BA degree (Economics). He obtained an MA degree (international relations) in 1973 from Lehigh University (Bethlehem, Penn) as James Ward Packet fellow in the Graduate School of International Relations

He has appeared in all courts for the Bahamas and the Privy Council since being admitted to the Bahamas Bar in December 1980, and a member of the Turks and Caicos Islands Bar, being there admitted in September 1981.

In addition to litigating precedent constitutional and public law cases in the Bahamian Courts and at the Privy Council, Mr Glinton has authored articles on aspects of Bahamian constitutional law and other topical areas for local and wider publication.

He is a past Vice-President of the Bahamas Bar Association.
