Thomas Roe QC practises from 3 Hare Court Chambers in London, specialising in commercial litigation and arbitration, and in constitutional, international and human rights law. He has frequently represented and advised the British government and the governments of numerous other states and territories around the Commonwealth, especially in the Caribbean. He has acted for many litigants challenging governmental action in the UK and abroad. He has appeared for and against the British government in the UK Supreme Court and has often appeared in the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council. Until his appointment as Queen's Counsel he was one of the Junior Counsel to the Crown appointed by the Attorney-General of England & Wales.

His commercial work is similarly international and has included substantial international arbitrations both defending and bringing claims against sovereign states. He has argued several reported cases on corporate governance and fiduciary duties. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. He has been specially admitted to the Bars of The Bahamas and Antigua & Barbuda. He studied English Literature and Law at Downing College, Cambridge, was called to the Bar of England & Wales in 1995 and was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2014.
