INFORMATION ON THE ISLANDS OF THE BAHAMAS FOR THE CLC LAW CONFERENCE 2021


HISTORICAL INFORMATION:

The Bahamas an archipelagic country with unique and striking characteristics, comprises of 700 islands, rocks and cays, 30 of which are inhabited. The name Bahamas is of Lucayan derivation, although some historians believe it is from Spanish 'bajamar,' meaning "shallow water."

The Bahamian climate which is one of the greatest attractions, is mild throughout the year, with temperatures varying from the low 70 degrees Fahrenheit during the winter to the low 80s during the summer. The Bahamian climate seldom drops below 60 degrees or reaches a high of 90 degrees or more.

The Bahamian people are humble and hospitable in nature. The majority of which are descendants from the African slaves who were transported from Africa by the Europeans. The Bahamas has a rich history and colorful culture unlike anywhere in the world. The Bahamian culture can be described as an amalgam of African, British and American influences. The African culture is vividly expressed through the celebration of Junkanoo, a festival that is held annually during the months of December and January.






MAGARITAVILLE BEACH RESORT

GEOGRAPHICAL LAYOUT OF THE EXUMA ISLANDS AND CAYS



The Exuma Island chain is divided into three major areas, Great Exuma, Little Exuma and the Exuma Cays. The largest in the chain is Great Exuma. This is where you will find most large hotels and resorts. The Exuma International Airport is also located in Great Exuma.

The Exumas are renowned for their sapphire-blue waters—waters so stunning, their brilliant colours are visible even from outer space. This chain of 365 islands is home to secluded footprint-free beaches, deserted cays, and ultra-exclusive resorts. Here, nature outnumbers man, coastlines remain flawless, and private islands play host to some of the world's most famous stars—including a group of four-legged local celebrities.

ATTRACTIONS AND THINGS TO DO:

Swimming with the pigs is one experience you simply cannot miss while you are here. Wondering how the pigs got to Pig Beach? We do not know for sure. Big Major Cay is un-inhabited, and the pigs are not native to the island. Some say they were left by a group of sailors, who planned to come back and cook them. Or that the pigs swam over from a shipwreck nearby. Wherever they came from, there are now about 20 pigs and piglets living the easy life, with daily visits from Bahamians and tourists. When you visit, be sure to get a selfie with the **#swimmingpigs**—they are even cuter in person.

Island hopping through the islands of Exuma is truly an extraordinary experience.

Among other popular and activities are to snorkel a plane wreck, charter a boat to explore un-inhabited cays, protected coves and secret sandbars. Visitors can also spot a native sloop, which is a Bahamian made sailboat with wooden hulls, canvas sails and tall wooden masts.











GEOGRAPHICAL LAYOUT OF ANDROS ISLAND



Andros Island is divided into North, Central, South Andros and Mangrove Cay, is the largest island in The Bahamas. An island so vast and green, locals call it the "Big Yard." Andros

remains virtually untouched. Vast and green, it holds countless adventures for lovers of the outdoors. World-class scuba diving, deep-sea and fly fishing, national forests and blue holes—and that is just the beginning.

ATTRACTIONS AND THINGS TO DO:

Andros island is the ideal spot for investigating blue holes. The island has more than 180 blue holes, found inland and alongside the shores.

You can experience the thrill of scuba diving and snorkel around the Andros Barrier Reef, the thirdlargest fringing barrier reef in the world. It drops to about eight feet on the island side and approximately 6,000 feet in the Tongue of the Ocean.

You can also enjoy a day of Fly Fishing. Nobody knows the Andros flats like the local fishing guides do. Bahamians like Glaister and Mary have spent a lifetime mastering the art, getting to know the waters and the fish that swim them.

Visit the factory, where the Androsia handmade Batik are manufactured. Androsia Batik has been called the unofficial fabric of The Bahamas, and it has been handmade on Andros Island since the very beginning.

Exploring a deep-sea frontier is another adventure you can embark upon. On Andros Island, venturing out on your first dive is easier than you might imagine.



You must plan to Island Hop. A boat trip makes everyday better. Eleuthera and Harbour Island are surrounded by a handful of islands and cays that make them perfect for island hopping.

You can visit beaches that have beautiful pink sand, where you can sink your toes in the sand.

Additionally, you can walk through pineapple fields, as Eleuthera grows some of the sweetest pineapples.

The iconic and popular glass window bridge will stop you in your tracks, as it is quite the stunning scene. You will be stunned by how the deep blue waters of the Atlantic Ocean meet the turquoise Bight of Eleuthera.

You can take a surf at Surfer's Beach. Located on the North End of Eleuthera, a two-mile stretch of white sand attracts serious surfers with powerful, sometimes shoulder-high waves.

You can also visit Ocean Hole which is located on the Southern edge of Rock Sound in South Eleuthera.

Furthermore, you can explore Queen's Bath, located South of the Glass Window Bridge. The Queen's Bath is a rocky collection of natural pools, formed by centuries of crashing waves. You must explore this natural wonder at low tide when the sun warms the pools to just the right temperature.

Visit the historic Twin Churches. Two similar twin-towered churches in Clarence Town are credited to Father Jerome Hawes. Both churches are a historic must see.



The resort sits poised directly on Cape Santa Maria Beach; a four-mile vista of bright white sand that has been recognized as one of the top 10 beaches in the world.



One of the smallest inhabited islands in The Bahamas, San Salvador is unique in the archipelago. Its sparkling inland lakes, various historic monuments, miles of secluded beaches and roughly 50 dive sites keep visitors well entertained.

ATTRACTIONS AND THINGS TO DO:

Find a sandy beach. The beaches on San Salvado are secluded by definition, with powdery white sand and azure waters. Among them, Grotto Beach, and Snow Beach are traveler favorites.

Drop an anchor in a pristine bay. A boat is your key to untold beauty when you spend time exploring San Salvador's Dim Bay, Long Bay and Snow Bay.

Discover and explore dive sites. Diving is paramount on the island. San Salvador is renowned for great and varied diving.

Stalk the flats of the island. You can set a new record by catching blue marlins, wahoo, dolphins, kingfish and tuna.



ATTRACTIONS AND THINGS TO DO:

Visit the highest point in the Bahamas, Mt. Alvernia, called Como Hill by locals. This hill is 206 feet (63 m) above sea level. Atop the hill sits The Hermitage, a medieval stone monastery built in 1939. A light hike with great rewards.

If you visit Cat Island falls in June, you're in for a show at the Annual Rake and Scrape Festival, where authentic Bahamian sounds are accompanied by quadrille dancing.

Fish a new frontier. Cat island's creeks and flats are unspoiled and under the expert guidance of local certified fly-fishing guides and charter companies' anglers can have the option to fish for a big game catch or the elusive bonefish.






Chez Pierre Hotel is comprised of six wooden beachfront cottages, built on stilts, with screened-in porches and colorful stairs leading up to them.

Set your sights on snook. Between the bonefish-filled flats and the deep waters that surround the island, the opportunities for good fishing abound.


