THE BAD Economic Impact on Sports – a Snapshot



Postponing the Olympics to 2021 cost US\$5.8 billion



Sports Value - the global sports market direct economic contribution exceeds US\$760 billion annually.



2020 - Estimates in USA are loss of \$12.3 billion in earnings for 3 months.
That's an average of \$133.4 million in earnings every day, or \$92.6K every minute



In USA alone 1.3
Million jobs lost in sports related sector March – June, 2020
